**Thank you** again to those who have kindly provided wine, cakes, tea, coffee, and sweets for the children, for our celebration after mass last Sunday.

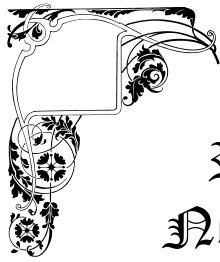
