All Saints' Day – Thursday 1 November: There will be two masses to celebrate our Patronal Festival – at 11.00 a.m. and a sung mass at 8.00 p.m. There will be wine and refreshments after the 8.00 p.m. mass.

All Souls' will be celebrated on Friday 2 November, with a mass at 10.00 a.m. and a sung mass at 8.00 p.m. Please print (*clearly*) on the lists in the Hall the names of those you would like to be remembered at one of these masses.

Our annual "**In Loving Remembrance**" service will be held on **Sunday 4 November** at 6.30 p.m. As we are expecting a number of visitors, it is hoped that members of the congregation will attend and help to greet them at the refreshments after the service. If you propose to come and would like **1 or 2** of your departed loved ones remembered during the service, do write their name(s) on the list in the Hall.
